Leo's Lapidary Lounge - The Club Rock Shop

This is the club's lapidary facility for members, so called because it is presided over by our Vice President and Lapidarist Extraordinaire, Leo Cloutier.

It is open on the Saturday immediately following the club's monthly meeting from 9 AM until 12 PM. Club members may bring their rough rocks or slabs to work with the club's lapidary tools.

The shop is equipped with professional-grade lapidary tools, including:

- ✓ Diamond Pacific Titan six-wheel cabbing machine
- ✓ Diamond Pacific Genie six-wheel cabbing machine
- ✓ 8" Expando Drum unit set up for polishing
- ✓ Silicon carbide cabbing wheels
- ✓ Flat lap machine for polishing
